11. First Reading Ordinances

#986 Introduction of PUBLIC HEARING: Zoning Ordinance Amendment - Marijuana Uses

Council President Irace called for the introduction of "AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF OCEANPORT, COUNTY OF MONMOUTH AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY AMENDING CHAPTER 390 OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF OCEANPORT, ENTITLED "ZONING" BY CREATING A SECTION PROHIBITING BUSINESSES ENGAGED IN THE GROWTH OR SALE OF MEDICINAL AND RECREATIONAL MARIJUANA OR PARAPHENALIA IN ANY ZONING DISTRICT" and then asked the Clerk to read the proposed Ordinance by title only, after which Council President Irace moved to approve the Ordinance upon first reading and to hold the public hearing on the proposed ordinance at the Council meeting of April 19, 2018 and to advertise same in accordance with the law, which was seconded by Councilman Solan.

12. Second Reading Ordinances**#985 PUBLIC HEARING - Peddlers & Solicitation**

Councilwoman Cooper called for the 2nd Reading and Public Hearing providing for an ordinance for a police chaplain and asked the Clerk to read the affidavit of publication of the proposed ordinance by title only. **"AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF OCEANPORT, COUNTY OF MONMOUTH AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY ENTITLED "PEDDLERS & SOLICITATION"** was published in the LINK News on March 8, 2018.

PUBLIC HEARING: The Mayor opened the meeting for public comment on this ordinance only. There being none, the Mayor closed the public hearing on a motion by Councilman Solan, which was seconded by Councilman Proto. Councilman Proto made a motion to adopt the ordinance and advertise in accordance with the law, which was seconded by Councilman Deerin.

13. Council Reports

1. Councilman Proto, Planning & Development – not present.
2. Council President Irace, Finance & Administration Liaison: Council President Irace commented on the budget meetings; the state of Federal and New Jersey taxing and its impacts locally; the balance of wants and needs and efforts to keep municipal taxes down where possible.
3. Councilman Gallo, Public Works & Engineering Liaison: Councilman Gallo reported that Public Works was in the process of repairing potholes around town
4. Councilwoman Cooper, Health and Human Services Liaison: Councilwoman Cooper reported on Water Watch Committee testing results, increased levels likely due to recent storms, that the waters around Oceanport are not designated as high use for bathing, attendance of NJDEP at their last meeting and their desire to work with Oceanport in their goal to improve the quality of the Shrewsbury River and was willing to take on the testing but could use help with the labor. Councilwoman Cooper also reported on Environmental Commission meeting and questions concerning that the catch basins on Shore Road were not flowing properly. Mr. Poerio commented that the road actually needs to be lifted and was on the Borough's plan for 2019 but they could certainly look at the existing drainage. Other items discussed were low lying wires near the First Aid and the status of clean up at Old Wharf Park after the work performed by NJ American Water; and their review of Planning Board matters and to date had no problems with any of them.
5. Councilman Solan, Public Safety Liaison - Councilman Solan announced the Hook & Ladder's Annual Ham Dinner and the importance of this year's fundraising efforts due to some projects that need to be accomplished including re-paving of their parking lot.
6. Councilman Deerin, Parks & Recreation – not present.

- 14. Mayor Coffey's Report:** Mayor Coffey commented on the proposed capital improvements for Myrtle Avenue and Monmouth Boulevard including drainage, installation of sidewalks, new pavement and working with the County to accomplish solutions for the ongoing issues in that area. Mayor Coffey further commented on the budget process, other shared services being considered, the phenomenal cooperation from the County and Freeholder Director Arnone, Mr. Poerio's comprehensive plan for the next 5, 7 or more years is something future administrations will be able to use rather than patching and band-aids going along and hopes the Council will take an indepth look at it. Mayor Coffey also reported on his attendance at the Fort Monmouth Historical Committee, number of upcoming projects in Oceanport on the former Fort and the importance of getting Oceanport on a strong footing before those changes come. Mayor Coffey lastly announced the Oceanport PTO event fundraiser being held tomorrow night.

- 15. Petitions from the public:** Mayor Coffey then opened the meeting to anyone from the public who wished to be heard.

Jeff Oakes, 60 Pemberton Ave., expressed his displeasure and anger at the introduction of the zoning amendment to prohibit marijuana business uses, the anger at the proposed legalization of recreational use that has impacted medicinal users.

Council President Irace commented that the ordinance was not against medical marijuana and he supports that use and hopes it helps everyone that needs it.

Susan Frankel-Viana, Burnt Mill Circle, asked about the wording of the ordinance language specifically stating both recreational and medicinal. Mayor Coffey explained that it is for both only as it pertains to business uses. Ms. Viana further commented on her position that Oceanport has an opportunity to make a difference, the challenges faced by her own family specifically her son who is participant in the medicinal program. There was lengthy discussion on the issues of dispensaries, the number allowed by the State, their locations, the limited access to the medicinal marijuana, the impact of proposed legislation to legalize recreational use, the societal problems with alcohol and drugs that leads to the public's perspective on the topic, whether action of this type was pre-emptive and the timing of opening discussions.

Vincent DeGiulio, 532 Center Ave., Middletown, thanked Councilwoman Cooper for taking the time to research the subject. Mr. DeGiulio also expressed frustration with the misperception of the public on the marijuana topic and urged the town to discuss allowing a dispensary. Discussion ensued.

Matthew Viana, 19 Burnt Mill Circle, appeared and stated he was in the program, he recently had colon surgery, they wanted to give him pain killers and was concerned about becoming addicted and chose to use marijuana and asked the Governing Body how they would feel if it were their son and had to fight like this to get the medication needed.

As no one else from the public appeared to be heard, the Mayor closed that portion of the meeting.

- 16. Adjournment:** As there was no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 8:13pm on a motion by Councilman Gallo and seconded by Council President Irace and approved by the Council.

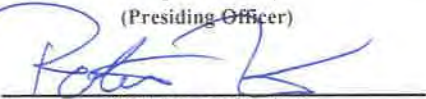

WHEREAS, the shoreline was dramatically affected, and continues to be affected; and,
