

REGULAR MEETING MINUTES

Oceanport, New Jersey
November 1, 2012

The Regular Meeting of the Oceanport Mayor and Council was called to order on November 1, 2012 at 7:13 P.M. with Mayor Mahon announcing that the meeting had been properly advertised in accordance with the law.

CLERK/ADMINISTRATOR REPORT: Ms. Jungfer along with Chief Financial Officer, Greg Mayers, gave an explanation of the Borough's seeking of emergency funds for storm expenses. Ms. Jungfer then stated there were 3 items on the consent agenda and asked for a motion. Councilwoman Kahle made a motion to approve the Consent agenda which was seconded by Councilman Johnson and approved by Council.

MAYOR MAHON: Mayor Mahon updated everyone on the storm's impact, the Borough's response and recognized Borough Staff and Department Heads – each Department Head gave a report on storm response. Mayor Mahon also advised where the public could go for information and assistance, identified which parties would be working with the Borough and FEMA, what FEMA programs were available and where to go for that information.
