

REGULAR MEETING

Oceanport, New Jersey
September 13, 1993

REGULAR MEETING: The regular meeting of the Oceanport Mayor and Council was called to order on September 13, 1993 at 8:01 P.M.

MEMBERS PRESENT: Councilpersons Clark, Filippone, Miller, Taylor, Wolfe and Mayor Cavanagh.

MEMBERS ABSENT: Councilman Terra.

OFFICIALS PRESENT: Borough Clerk, Patricia L. Varca and Borough Attorney, Francis A. Margalotti.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE: Mayor Cavanagh led the audience and members of the Council in the flag salute.

As copies of the minutes from the Regular Meeting held on September 2, 1993 had been made available for review by the Governing Body, Councilman Miller moved to waive the reading of same and approve the minutes as presented by the Clerk. It was seconded by Councilman Clark and approved by Council.

CLERK'S REPORTS: NO REPORTS.

COMMITTEES:

COUNCILMAN CLARK: Councilman Clark asked the Clerk to read resolution **R-93-48** changing the Borough position of Supervisor of Accounts Payable to Assistant Treasurer, after which he moved to approve same. It was seconded by Councilwoman Filippone and approved by Council. **R-93-48**

COUNCILMAN TERRA: ABSENT.

COUNCILWOMAN FILIPPONE: NO REPORT.

COUNCILMAN MILLER: Councilman Miller reported that at the Summer's End Festival surveys were handed out to residents asking their views on Storer Cable and he hoped that most of the people would return them so that the Council will be able to know how the residents feel about the services they are receiving from Storer.

Councilman Miller advised under the Waterwatch Committee that the new boat is being readied by Steve Remaley at Pleasure Bay Marina and hopefully the Committee will be able to launch the boat this weekend.

Councilman Miller advised under the Waterways Committee that Chris Widdis had been out taking water samples on September 8 and the sites at Casa Comida, Oceanport Marina and Itaska Place were all greater than 1600 and the other sites were normal.

Councilman Miller commented that under Recreation, the basketball courts at both Community Center and Trinity Park had been resurfaced, with some minor work still to be done on the court at Trinity Park and the striping will be taken care of in the near future. He added that the bocce courts at Old Wharf Park are completed and they look great and he has received some good feedback on the courts.

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Councilman Miller stated that the Summer's End Festival was a great day with many different activities being undertaken this year, from a wide variety of food vendors to face painting, ball games, etc. He also wanted to congratulate the police for having a dunking booth raising funds for philanthropic purposes. He also commented that the fireworks this year were excellent and everyone seemed to enjoy the day.

Councilman Miller requested that the next time the Mayor meets with the representative of Fort Monmouth at his monthly Mayors meeting, that he bring up a new policy at Fort Monmouth, where the host town must supply the bus to bring over the Army Band and since there are a limited amount of bus companies on the list approved by the Fort, it cost the Recreation Committee \$328, which is \$200 more than the buses they use for class trips, etc. at the schools.

COUNCILMAN TAYLOR: Councilman Taylor reminded the residents that the next Drug Alliance meeting was scheduled for September 22 at the Maple Place School at 7:30 P.M. and all interested parties were welcome to attend.

Councilman Taylor also advised that the County would be holding another Hazardous Waste day on October 16 at the Hazlet Township County Garage and he had posted the notice in the entrance to Borough Hall.

COUNCILMAN WOLFE: Councilman Wolfe called for the introduction of an ordinance amending the lot maintenance ordinance and asked the Clerk to read the proposed ordinance by title only as follows: **AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AND SUPPLEMENT AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED "THE LOT MAINTENANCE ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF OCEANPORT" PASSED AND APPROVED ON AUGUST 7, 1969.**

Councilman Wolfe moved to approve this ordinance on first reading. It was seconded by Councilman Taylor.

The Clerk called the roll:

Mayor Cavanagh then opened the meeting to the public for any questions or comments.

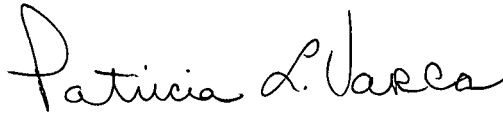
PETITIONS FROM THE PUBLIC:
